



# Moments of Impact



### Feeding the hungry, sheltering the homeless

Food and shelter are two of the most basic human needs that Catholic Charities addresses in the community.

St. Anthony Family Shelter is the only shelter in the area solely dedicated to serving families with minor children. St. Anthony provides a safe environment for the youngest family members, with programs to help families break the cycle of generational poverty, including assistance with employment, financial literacy and parenting skills.

Our Daily Bread Food Pantry remained open throughout the pandemic, with volunteers distributing prepackaged boxes of food to thousands of individuals and families who drove through the pantry's distribution line each month.

Bolstered by additional grant funding from the CARES Act, Catholic Charities' Supportive Services for Veteran Families helped 91 veterans with rent and utilities assistance so they could move from homelessness to stable housing.

Harbor House Domestic Violence Shelter is more than a house. Harbor House offers services to hundreds of survivors of domestic violence through community outreach, as well as to those who need to come into shelter.

Available services include advocacy, safety planning, counseling, employment assistance, shelter and housing. Harbor House's 24-hour crisis hotline serves as a gateway to services at any time of the day or night. Court advocates help with protection orders.

SAFE Project case managers offer financial literacy education and employment assistance. OVW Transitional Housing provides long-term housing assistance and case management for survivors and their families.
