Hunger & Homelessness

PRIORITY: Feed the Hungry, Shelter the Homeless

M any people in our community live on the brink of homelessness, and many more are uncertain if they will have enough food to feed themselves and their families. Food and shelter are two of the most basic human needs that Catholic Charities addresses through several of our ministries. In addition, our ministries have programs that assist with employment, financial literacy and parenting skills.

St. Anthony Family Shelter is a one-of-a-kind shelter in the Wichita area. It is the only homeless shelter that exclusively focuses on families with minor children. St. Anthony provides a safe environment for the youngest family members, with programs in place to help families break the cycle of generational poverty.

Domestic Violence

PRIORITY: Helping victims become survivors

Domestic violence and sexual assault happen every day in our community. That is the reason why *Harbor House Domestic Violence Shelter* has offered round-the-clock access to emergency shelter and advocacy services for the past 26 years. Harbor is so much more than a house. It is collaboration with community partners. It is outreach services. It is a crisis hotline. It is advocacy.

Thousands of survivors are helped each year through a wide range of outreach services provided in multiple settings including a 24/7 hour crisis hotline for assistance with referrals, healthy relationship education and safety planning, and full-time advocacy and protection order assistance at district court. Through the *SAFE Project* and *OVW Transitional Housing*, survivors can receive assistance with financial literacy, employment and housing.


Bianca's Story

Enrichment Services PRIORITY: Enriching lives at every stage of life

Through counseling, legal assistance and interpersonal connections, Catholic Charities enriches the lives of individuals, couples and families, immigrants, seniors and disabled adults.

Marriages and families are strengthened at Cana Counseling. People throughout the Diocese receive low-cost assistance navigating the maze of immigrations laws and paperwork at Immigration Services.

Active seniors can mentor or tutor children through the classroom Foster Grandparents Program while seniors suffering from dementia, Alzheimer's or loneliness can find stimulating interaction at Adult Day Services.

The enriching and affordable day programs for seniors and disabled adults at Adult Day Services also are a blessing to the families of program participants.

Catholic Charities serves the Kansas community beyond the Wichita metro area. Several of our ministries serve people throughout the 25-county area of the Diocese of Wichita.


